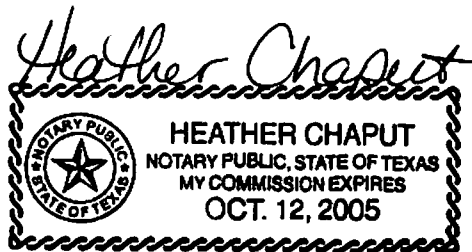

Dr Nathaniel SOBOYEJO attended the Postgraduate Certificate in Education course (Chemistry/Science) at the Centre for Educational Studies, King's College London, University of London in the academic year 1990/91. The Postgraduate Certificate in Education is a one year full time teacher training course for university graduates. The Department for Education and Skills recognises the course as an approved qualification for entry to the teaching profession in the United Kingdom and Dr Soboyejo's DfES reference number is 90/47433.

Dr Soboyejo's 36 week course consisted of:

1. Practically based work in teaching methods in Chemistry/Science and in the use of audio-visual and other aids (equivalent to two days a week for two terms).
2. Lecture/seminar programme on aspects of history, philosophy, psychology and sociology relevant to education. (Autumn Term three hours a week).
3. Practical teaching, including supervised teaching practice, in a secondary (age 11-18) school, School of St David and St Katharine in north London. (Total of 16 weeks).
4. One week workshop seminars on Race, Class and Gender, and The Future of Education, and a two day workshop concerned with Pastoral Care in Schools.
5. Two short courses, (two weeks for each course), on 'Computers for the Terrified' and 'Discipline in School'.

Assignments

6. An essay on 'Children's Communication through their Science Lessons'. (Pass)
7. A Subject Studies Assignment on 'Factors Affecting the Rate of a Chemical Reaction'. (Pass)
8. A Portfolio of educational material collected throughout the year. (Pass)

The Postgraduate Certificate in Education course is assessed on the basis of the student's performance in teaching practice, course work, essay, subject studies assignment, portfolio and two short courses. Assessment is either 'Pass' or 'Fail' and there is no distinction category and Dr Soboyejo's result was a Pass. Dr Soboyejo was awarded the Postgraduate Certificate in Education on 28 June 1991.
